ETHICS UPDATES



New to the HPW administrative team is Audrey Kruisselbrink, who is based in Wolfville NS. Audrey brings her expertise in ethics administration to the project. Here is an update on the journey though ethics review boards:

Ethics for the stakeholder interviews were approved by amendments to the ethics applications from the HPW Development Grant. Work on the ethics applications for the HPW survey and professional worker interviews (and for any new universities that were not included in the development grant) began in early 2019. On November 13, 2019, we received the University of Ottawa Certificate of Ethics Approval for the survey and worker interviews. Between December 2019 and March 2020, we received ethics approval for each project co-investigator from the remaining 15 university ethics boards. Ethics approvals have been obtained from the following universities:

- HPW Trainee Network, led by Dr. Jelena Atanackovic and Christina Young (PhD candidate), was established in October 2019. It includes graduate students and postdoctoral fellows with interests in mental health at work and/or gender.
- The network connects trainees from across different case study groups with different academic backgrounds, creating an opportunity for interdisciplinary exchange and networking. It aims to provide its members with an opportunity to develop their skills in research collaboration, leadership and knowledge dissemination. To that end, the network: 1) creates various professional development sessions for trainees (e.g. methodology seminars related to partnership);
 - 2) promotes peer mentorship;
 - 3) provides an opportunity for regular meetings with PI where trainees might ask any questions and discuss any challenges faced during the data collection; etc.

NETWORK MEETING

• While the timing of the meetings may vary depending on the needs of its members, the HPW trainee network aims to host meetings approximately every 1-2 months. The meetings are usually 1.5 hours in length. The first network meeting was held on November 21, 2019. Its goal was to onboard the trainees, introduce them to each other and provide an overview of the trainee network.

SECOND TEAM MEETING



December 2019

At our second Partnership meeting, we brought together by video conference and in person all of our case study teams, their respective partners as well as partners with cut across the case studies. Each team lead provided an update on new members, trainees and worker representatives in their teams, provide an update on data collection & recruitment to date and listed all presentations & papers. We also discussed the role of the partnership advisory committee, detailed the stakeholder/worker interviews and online survey to give partners a second opportunity to provide feedback.

WORKER ADVISORY COMMITTEE

We are pleased to have recruited members of the professional worker advisory committee from each of the seven case studies. Through two separate webinars, each of the members were provided with an overview of the project. A number of the professional worker advisors have also provided their input into the survey tool and interview guides.
