

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


SURVEY LAUNCH

On November 16, 2020, we launched the Healthy Professional Worker survey and worker interviews! COVID-19 PIVOT



Due to COVID-19, we made some changes to our research schedule in 2020. We stopped data collection from March - July and concentrated our activities on the literature review and survey development. The survey was reworked to include signposts for pre- and during-COVID questions and we added some COVIDspecific questions. As a result of this pivot, we were able to keep all of our trainees employed.

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

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TEAM UPDATES:

Christina Young, a trainee in the Academia subgroup, successfully defended her PhD in Social and Behavioural Health Sciences at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health, University of Toronto, in August. Her dissertation, Constrained Care: Doula Practice and Hospital Birth, examined how doulas -- non-medical care providers who offer emotional, physical, and informational support during the perinatal period -- accomplish their work in Toronto-area hospitals. Christina has moved on to a post-doc position at Memorial University of Newfoundland.

In August, Angela Freeman, trainee in the Midwifery subgroup, successfully defended her MSc thesis, Navigating early pregnancy loss in Ontario's healthcare system: A qualitative exploratory study of the experiences of midwifery clients and midwives, in the School of Public Health and Health Systems, University of Waterloo. The objective of her study was to understand how the healthcare-related experiences of both clients and providers can be improved from a systems perspective in cases of early pregnancy loss. Angela is a registered midwife currently dividing her time between providing maternity care in rural southwestern Ontario and disseminating her findings as supported by the AOM Mentored Midwifery Research Grant (MOH).

Nabeelah Ahmed worked as a research associate under the supervision of Dr. Ivy Bourgeault from the early days of the HPW project. Her own thesis research was inspired by the larger work of the project, where she conducted a case study of resident physicians in Ontario and their mental health experiences, resources, and challenges in post-graduate medical education. She successfully defended her thesis in April 2020 and now holds a Masters in Health Systems from the Telfer School of Management, University of Ottawa. She continues her involvement with the HPW Medicine team as an alumna and partner lending her expertise with new trainees in literature research and conducting qualitative interviews and working with the team lead to expand the outreach of the current work with the survey and interview recruitment.
