### PRELIMINARY FINDINGS REPORT RELEASE!



#### SUMMARY

On December 1st, 2021, we released our preliminary findings report, <u>"Healthy</u> <u>Professional Worker Partnership:</u> <u>Preliminary Comparative Findings"</u>. In this ongoing study, which examines mental health in the fields of academia, accounting, dentistry, medicine, midwifery, nursing and teaching, the findings indicate that **distress** and **burnout** have significantly increased in the **COVID-19 pandemic**. Among all of the workers and fields studied, the findings indicate that mental health has most visibly depreciated in nursing, midwifery, and teaching professions. Moreover, within each field, women's mental health has been found to be disproportionately affected.

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### ANNUAL PARTNERSHIP MEETING: SHARING PRELIMINARY FINDINGS

### 1

On September 28th, the Healthy Professional Worker Partnership hosted an **online meeting** with its partners and other interested individuals. It was a timely opportunity to **share our preliminary findings** from our literature reviews, stakeholder interviews and worker surveys and interviews.



**Ivy Bourgeault** kicked off with an overview of progress to date which included a review of over 375 published articles, 139 stakeholder interviews, 3759 worker surveys, and 282 worker interviews.

Number of Attendees: **88** (**52** Partner Organizations **36** HPW Leads, co-leads, & trainees)

Each of the team leads then presented their key findings in two rounds – first, the **academic, accounting, teaching** and **leadership teams** – followed by the health professional teams – **nursing, dentistry, medicine** and **midwifery.** Between each round of presentations, case study focused break out groups allowed for more focused discussion and interpretation supporting the next intervention phase of our research program.

The Partnership meeting **launched** our case study focused **webinar series** which our Accounting team started off in November and Medicine in December to be followed by the other teams in 2022.


#### DENTISTRY
